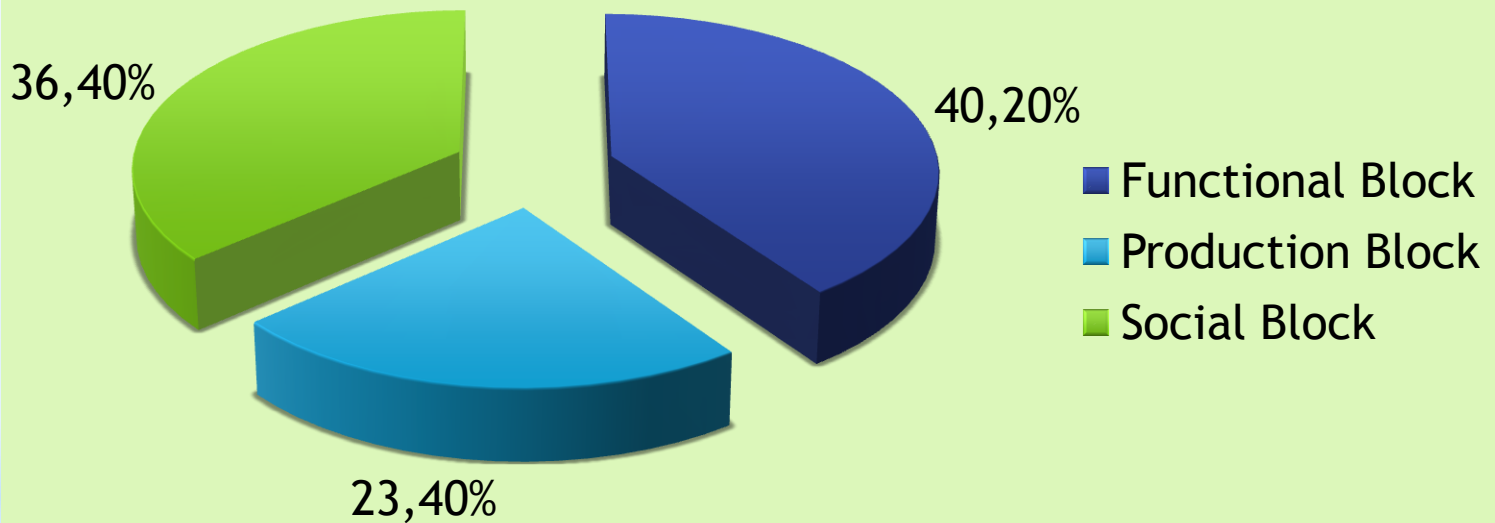

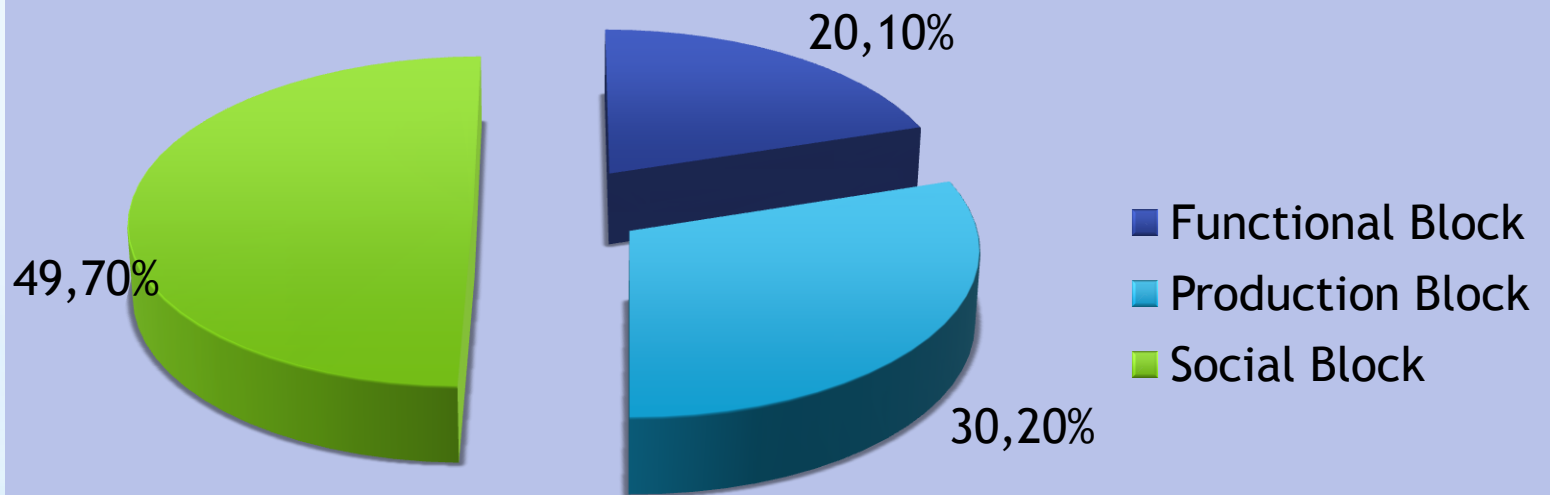

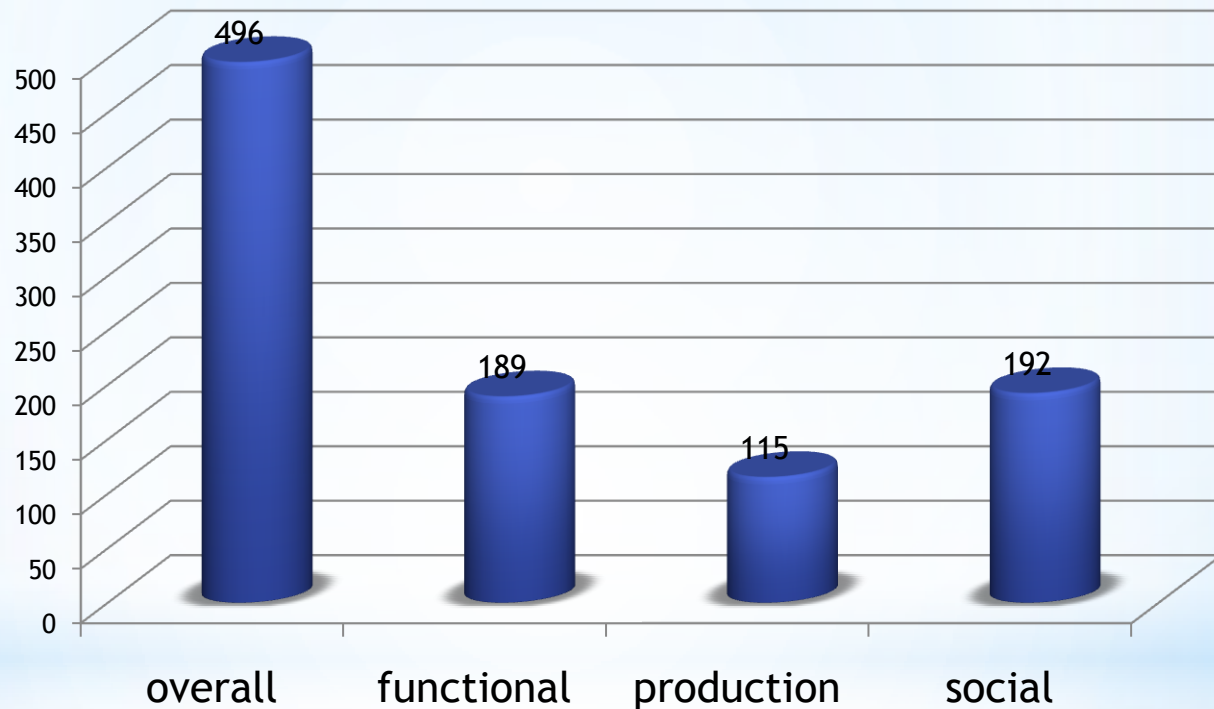
Strategy Measures Disaggregation by Blocks



Strategy Indicators Disaggregation by Blocks

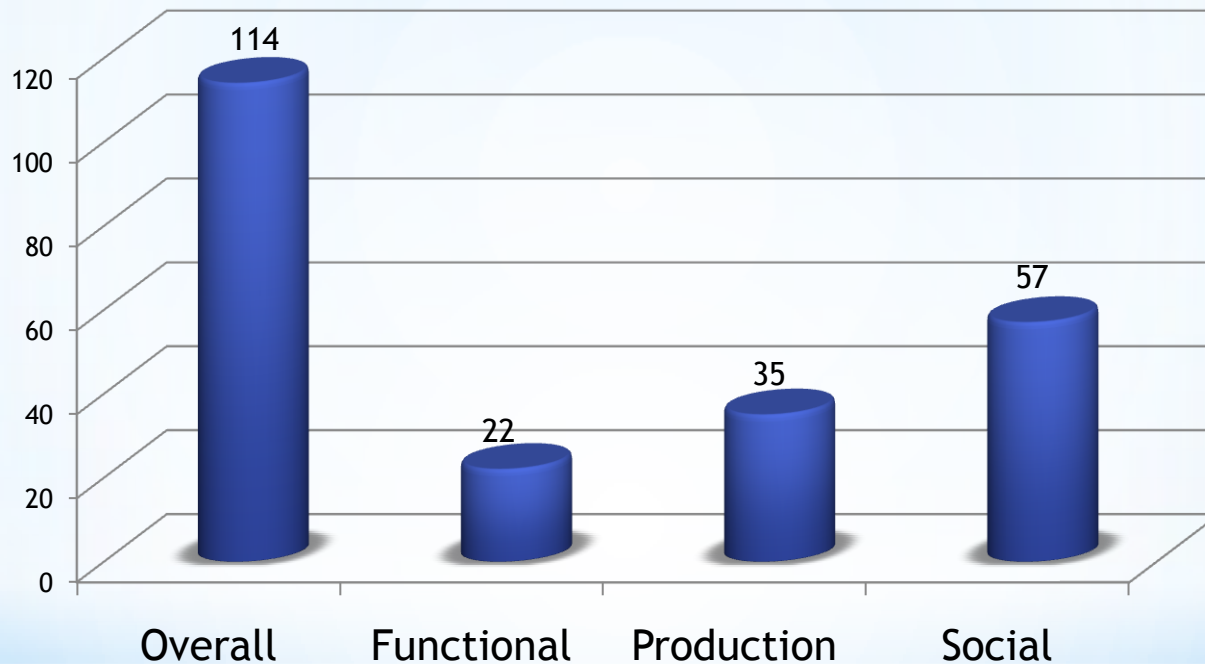


Outputs achieved by measures



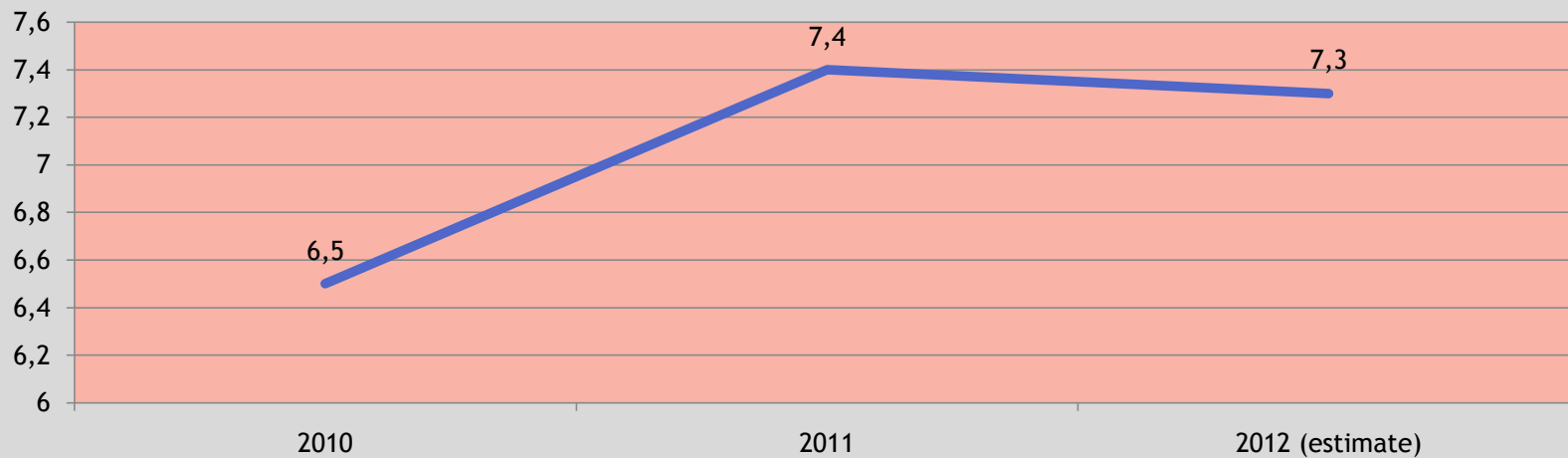
496 or 87% of all measures (569-100%) were implemented in this period

Outcomes achieved by indicators

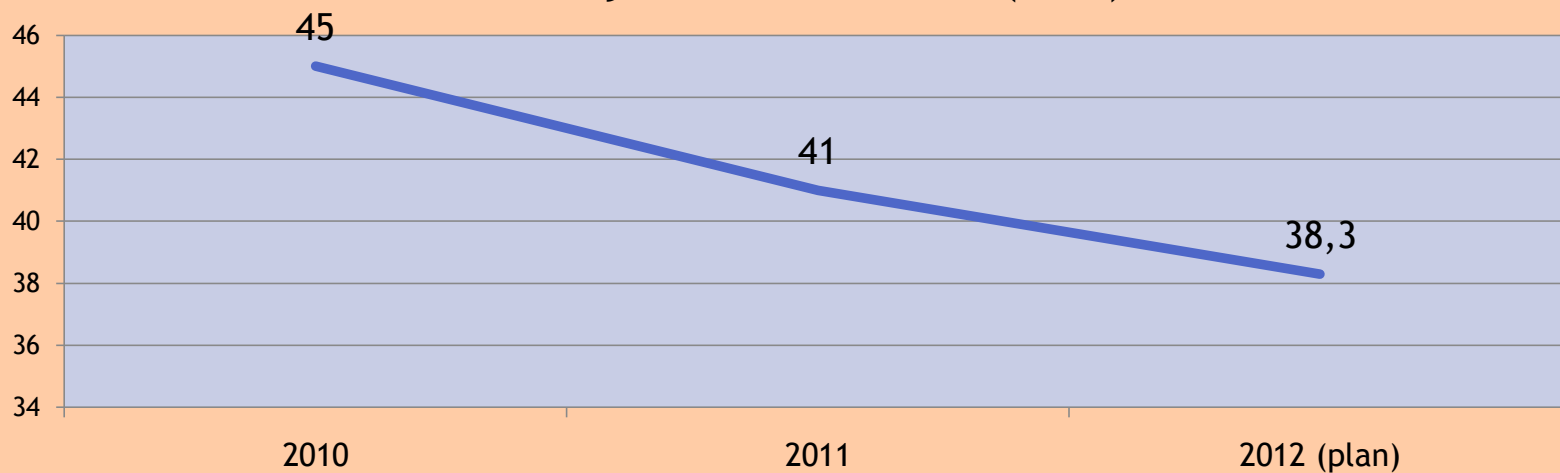


114 or 88% (129-100%) of overall indicators are under implementation in this period.

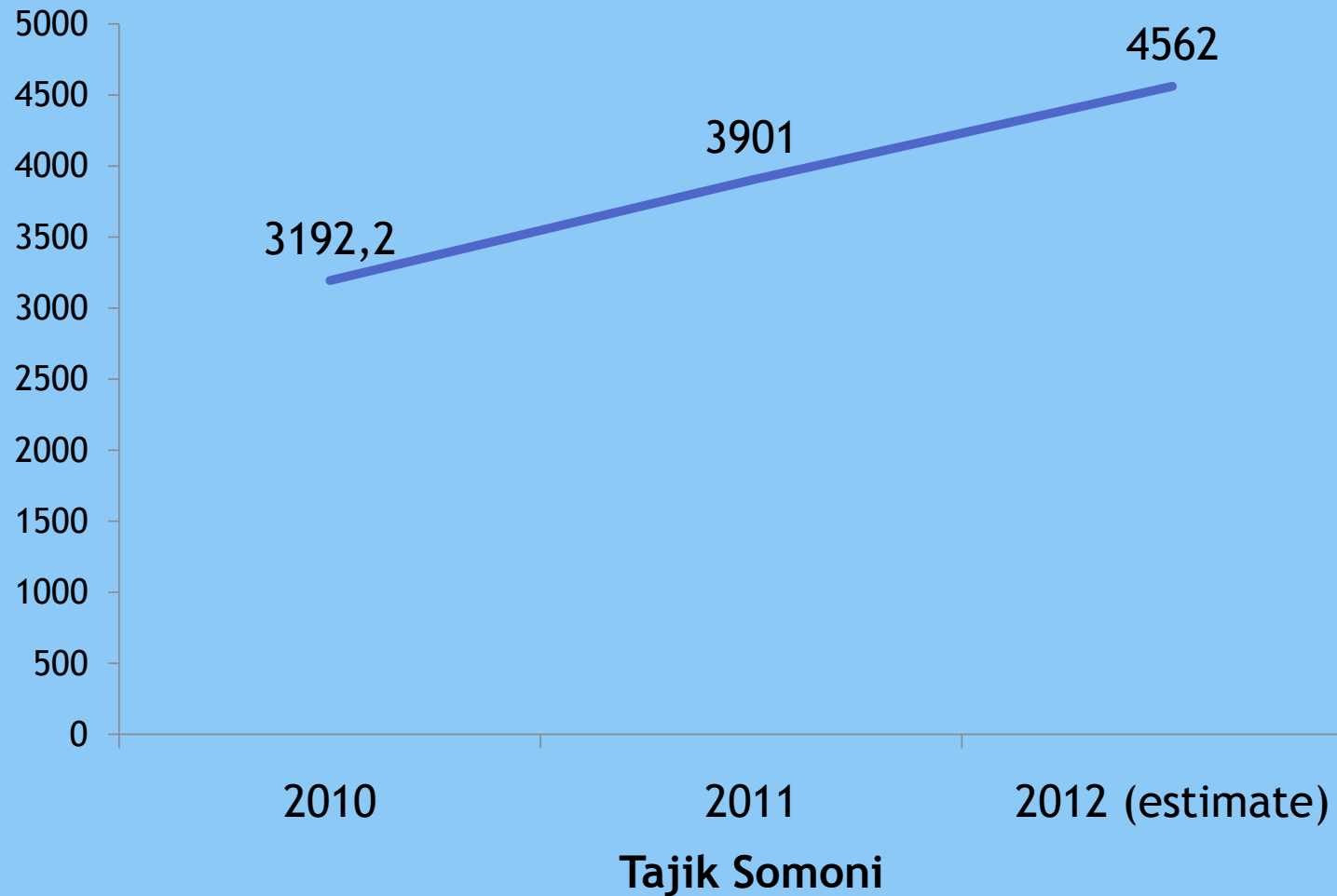
GDP Growth Rate (in %)
