2012 Work Program

Key Objectives

Linked to Busan High Level Forum outcomes and Joint Country Partnership Strategy (JCPS) commitments, DCC objectives for 2012 include:

- Further reinforcement of mutual accountability through thematic clusters and working groups;
- Improved operational coordination, e.g. joint visiting missions, joint analytical work, etc.; and
- Reducing transaction costs of development aid, *e.g.* decreasing parallel PIUs, sectorwide approaches, *etc*.

JCPS Shared Principles of Aid Effectiveness

The following recommendations from the JCPS progress report would enable the DCC to make significant progress against shared principles of aid effectiveness (annex 2 of JCPS):

- Non-government organizations (NGOs) initiate regular (e.g. semi-annually) dialogue/round-table meetings with (e.g.) 15-20 representative national and international NGOs to exchange information of mutual interest, evolving later into exploration of potential for collaborative activities in specific sectors and/or geographical regions (e.g. DCC/USAID to lead).
- Integration of joint project preparation and implementation management into ministerial structures i.e. reducing number of parallel PIUs over time (e.g. ADB/EBRD/WBG to lead).
- Identification upcoming projects/programs that may be candidates in 2012-13 for: (a) a sector-wide approach operation (e.g. an education SWAp based on NSED); (b) scaling up of a successful pilot/small-scale project for country-wide impact; (c) use of a country public financial management (PFM) system or process; or (d) a joint country or sector analytical task (e.g. DCC secretariat to lead).
- **Greater use of DCC website** to exploit communications and information-sharing potential of the website, now up and running—*e.g.* visiting mission schedules, VIP visits, conferences, seminars and workshops, country and sector strategies, *etc.*
- Medium-term (3-year) DCC secretariat staffing, budget and financing plan to ensure permanence, self-sustainability, and independence of DCC secretariat; to mobilize assured, unencumbered income of (e.g.) \$40-50,000 annually—i.e. enough to finance salaries of two (one senior, one junior) national staff members and related administrative operating/overhead expenses (communications, office supplies, etc.).

DCC Monthly Meetings

To broaden and deepen dialogue of monthly meetings, the following agenda items are proposed:

- Macroeconomic monitoring IMF Resident representative to provide quarterly briefings, e.g. March, June, September, and December, eventually supplemented by briefings from key GoT representatives (e.g. National Bank of Tajikistan and Ministry of Finance).
- **Sector strategy development** DCC cluster coordinators to provide quarterly (10-minute) briefings, *e.g.* March, June, September, and December.
- Thematic discussions brief presentation by DCC members/visiting representatives followed by discussion on current development issues or topics of general interest. Initial schedule as follows:
 - migration (January 2012, DFID/WB);
 - Tajikistan's medium-term development strategy 2013-15 (formerly known as PRS-4, April and September 2012);
 - results/impact measurement (June 2012, DFID); and
 - private sector investment (August 2012, Germany/IFC).
- Non-traditional development partners invite (e.g.) Chinese, Iranian, Russian, IsDB, other non-DCC partners to make brief presentations of their programs in Tajikistan.
- Visiting DCC VIPs/missions invite (e.g.) visiting ministers/senior officials (recent examples include DFID Secretary of International Development, ADB Vice President, and WB Regional Director) and missions of significant general interest to brief and/or exchange views with DCC members.

 - Preparatory meeting in May to review the balance of 2010 Development Forum Action Plan and initial preparation for November events.
