- Partners: AKDN, ADB, EBRD, Germany, OSCE, SIDA, SDC, DFID, UN Agencies, USAID, World Bank;
- One Strategy, One Coordination Mechanism and One M&E System.




Implementation of First Steps

Actions	Status
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • inaugurate annual strategic overview/planning meetings of DCC with Council of Ministers—commencing January, 2010; 	Ongoing
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • undertake annual Government/JCPS partner review of PRS implementation and results—commencing March, 2010; 	Completed in 2010
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • finalize PRS-3, 2010-12—incorporating the 2009-10 anti-crisis action plan—by 31 March, 2010; 	Completed in 2010
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • revise/simplify the PRS monitoring and evaluation framework/system—following finalization of PRS-3—including a substantial reduction in number of monitoring indicators—by 31 March, 2010; 	Completed in 2010
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • strengthen aid coordination unit of State Committee on Investments & State Property Management (SCISPM)—by recruiting additional staff, in-service training of existing staff, upgrading of equipment, etc.—with technical assistance planned by DfID/UNDP—by 31 December, 2011; and 	Ongoing
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • complete the ongoing MTEF process in all selected ministries—by 31 December, 2013. 	Ongoing

Next steps

- Define format and regularity of inter-ministerial interaction on aid coordination;
- Define format and regularity of interaction between the Government and development partners;
- Selection of pilot sectors for accelerated support in sector coordination and introduction of programme-based approach;
- (Joint) assessment of country systems and possibility of their use in aid projects and programmes implementation;
- Finalization of SCISPM restructuring and ensuring of adequate staff availability;
- Development of Aid Information Management System to revitalize aid transparency and aid coordination process;
- Paris Declaration Monitoring Survey (monitoring would allow collecting data on various aspects of JCPS);



Paris Declaration (and JCPs) Monitoring Survey

Monitor implementation of commitments made in Paris and Accra – 12 indicators against 2005 baseline

Key input to HLF4 in Busan

Stimulate broad-based dialogue at country-level

- Identify opportunities and bottlenecks for implementing aid effectiveness agenda

- Foster a shared understanding

- Track progress across time

 - Manages the survey
 - Ensures relevant stakeholders are informed of the survey
 - Convenes and chairs meetings needed to complete the survey
 - Ensures quality control and consistency of data
 - Submits data to OECD Secretariat






Conclusion
