## KEY OPPORTUNITIES IN THE SECTOR FOR DCC TO KNOW

- Support the Government in providing formalized pre-departure orientation trainings for prospective migrants before leaving to ensure safe, orderly, and regular migration.
- Explore opportunities for skills development, remittances investment and diaspora engagement to leverage the benefits of migration throughout Tajikistan.
- Support sustainable reintegration, strengthen social cohesion, and promote good governance.
- Provide protection and assistance to migrants vulnerable to violence, exploitation and abuse, and develop institutional capacity to prevent and address migrant smuggling and human trafficking.
- Provide technical support to advance on the 2030 agenda, notably on the target 10.7, fully consistent with the Global Compact on Migration.

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## KEY CHALLENGES IN THE SECTOR

- Lack of publicly available disaggregated migration data. This concerns multiple sectors such as prospective migrants, return migrants, incoming foreign migrants, remittances data.
- The high staff turnover at all levels in government structures makes it difficult to strategically plan capacity building activities.
- Return migration is overlooked and underfunded, besides this being a structural issue creating risks related to negative outcomes for returned migrants, reintegration, and community stability.
- Inter-agency cooperation both in migration governance (skills development, ethical recruitment, legal protection...) and in the participation in national and regional fora is low, impeding progress.
