KEY OPPORTUNITIES IN THE SECTOR FOR DCC TO KNOW

- The government has endorsed the Social Protection Strategy until 2040, employing a life-cycle approach to protect vulnerable children and families, aligning with national and global priorities.
- MoHSP, with the support of UNICEF and the WB, is conducting a social protection assessment to create a valuable opportunity for evidencebased SP reforms.
- MoHSP, with the support of the DCC-Social Protection WG, has developed a 3-year Plan of Action (2024-26), aiming for an inclusive and shock-responsive SP system.
- The SP Strategy and its PoA offer a critical opportunity to integrate SP with national disaster risk reduction strategy, bolstering resilience and enhancing linkages with preparedness and response.
- The state programme to enhance the Social Sector Workforce creates a pivotal opportunity to establish an integrated system by expanding the capacities of human resources and outreach.

KEY CHALLENGES IN THE SECTOR

- Despite a robust political commitment to social protection, the focus has primarily been on social insurance for formal workers, with state budget allocation for social assistance covering only approximately 15% of the population and heavily relying on external assistance.
- The current SP system is fragmented and faces efficiency and effectiveness challenges due to a lack of coordination.
- The system also lacks digitalization, comprehensive vulnerability data, and a coherent targeting approach.
- The sector currently has an inadequate monitoring and evaluation function, suffering from a lack of sufficient M&E staff
