# Objectives

- **Aim** - Reduce and prevent avoidable loss of life and disability during and after disaster through effective mass casualty management
- **Specific Objective** - Strengthen the health system's capacity to effectively manage mass casualty incidents through coordination of life saving emergency medical care delivery to disaster victims

# Outcomes

- Strategic recommendations for Mass Casualty Incident (MCI) Management
- Mass Casualty Management (MCM) Plans developed for system and hospital levels
- Training Guidelines and Standards for MCI management developed and tested
- National and local health system staff and first responders demonstrate MCM skills

# Lessons so far

- Mixing participants from various agencies and levels of responsibility in discussion groups offers important insights into interoperability during disaster
